Quick Checklist - Grow Mint In A Pot

Pick a variety you would like to grow.

- Peppermint
- Spearmint
- Pineapple mint
- Lemon mint
- Apple mint

Buy the required items from your local garden center or

online.

- Mint seeds
- Seed starting tray
- Potting mix
- Pot (10-inches H x 18-inches W)
- Slow-release fertilizer
- Liquid fertilizer

Pick a season to grow mint, either spring or fall.

Mix the slow-release fertilizer with the potting mix.

Grow Mint In A Pot

Fill the seed tray with potting mix. Place 2-3 seeds on the soil.

Spray water to keep the potting mix moist till seeds germinate.

Once the seedlings have germinated and grown 2-3 inches in height, you can transplant them to a bigger pot. Fill the potting mix into the pot till 1 inch from the rim. Dig a hole in the center of the potting mix. Take the mint plant out of the seed tray and place in this hole. Add potting mix so the roots of the mint plant are covered.

Water the soil well with a watering can.

Grow Mint In A Pot

Place the pot in a location that gets 6-8 hours of indirect sunlight.

Every day check the moisture by sticking your finger 1 inch into the soil.

Water the soil well if it has turned dry.

Thin the seedlings if there are too many in the pot.

Add liquid fertilizer to the soil every two weeks.

Harvest mint leaves when the plant grows 4-6 inches.
